Background

The remote access world demands the need for more skills. An enhancement in academic skills and soft skills is an essential part of personality development. The skills, required to fit in at the workplace, include your personality, emotional intelligence, attitude, flexibility, motivation, and manners. The present LDP has focused on conducting the sessions to work on select skills such as Interviews, Presentations, and communication which are the cruxes of the placement of professionals at varied places such as Universities, colleges, etc

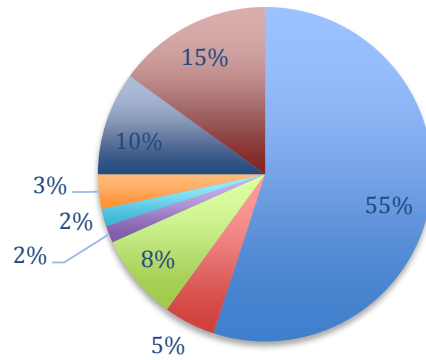
The basic objectives were to guide the LIS professionals to become efficient communicators through activity-based sessions, to understand various issues faced by the professionals during the interview process through conducting panel Interviews, to enlighten the library professionals about presentation skills, and to give an opportunity to interact with experts in the LIS field.

The program was based on conducting activity-based sessions on communication, Interview & presentation skills including the MOC interviews and activity-based communication exercises.

Response

60 LIS professionals attended the LDP workshop; the total distribution is elaborated below as per the designation; after a gap of 3 years of pandemic and post-pandemic, this was the first LDP of the MANLIBNET, India. The program got an overwhelming response as per the expectation; the professionals registered from Mumbai, Pune, Ahmednagar, Nasik, Narayangaon, Baramati

Keynote address and the program sessions

Dr. [M.G. Sreekumar](#), President of MANLIBNET India delivered a speech on “Libraries, Discovery and the Catalogue: Scale Workflow and Attention”; he focused on the improvement of technical skills and focused on the effective utilization of technological tools for improving the library service performance. He also elaboratively discussed the case study of Jio University, Mumbai, and guided the participants in the use of open-source library software.

The Program started with the background of the topic and the objective of choosing the theme given by Prof Dr Mrs Meenal Oak Coordinator LDP MANLIBNET India. Dr. M G Sreekumar President of MANLIBNET India gave his valuable opening remarks by mentioning the need for discussion of such topics on the platforms for the benefit of the LIS fraternity and also indicated his concern about the importance of soft skills for the LIS professionals; after the introduction of the chairperson and panel members, the chairperson invited the panel members to contribute by expressing their thoughts on the topic. Dr. Akhtar Parvez mentioned the importance of Library Resources and also communication as a medium for the better utilization of the same; Dr. Meeta Rathod highlighted the need for continuously upgrading the skills to remain sustainable. Dr. Jay Bhatt mentioned the global-level scenario about the profession and also stressed the need to remain relevant in the changing scenario, he discussed the service-related issues in front of the professionals at the global level and also the issues in the research process such as paper retraction, plagiarism and also mentioned the need for the LIS professionals to focus on the research support services; whereas Dr. Subhash Athavale stressed the importance of the status of the librarian and also mentioned the unawareness about the LIS professionals towards the status and also the University Public Libraries Act; Dr. Shubhada Nagarkar underlined the role of LIS Schools mentioned the decreasing ratio of the students towards the LIS profession; Prof (Dr.) Mrs . Meenal Oak highlighted the requirement of teamwork for attracting the students towards the LIS stream, also mentioned the importance of the status of the Librarian in the same, and discussed the scenario of LIS programs with respect to distance learning and the conventional educational systems. Mr. Kishor Ingale mentioned in bullet points, the need for the technology in the LICs and also to remain consistently upgraded for effective information delivery. The panel discussion ended with

the remarks of Dr. Sreekumar on the note of focused interactive efforts for the betterment of the profession is the need of the hour.

Valedictory function:

The function was marked by the overwhelming feedback given by the participants. The participants mentioned the usefulness of the sessions, also specifically appreciate the activity-based sessions, and mentioned the need to conduct the need for activity-based sessions in the future.

The valedictory speech delivered by the director Prof. (Dr.) Santosh Deshpande, MES's IMCC praised the work done by Prof Dr. Mrs. Meenal Oak for the library development for the effective service provision in the virtual and offline mode and also for the development of the profession at the state, national & international levels.

In the closing remarks, Dr. M G Sreekumar, President MANLIBNET, appreciated the efforts of Prof (Dr.) Mrs. Meenal Oak the LDP coordinator and also praised her for the selection of the need-based theme for the LDP conduction.

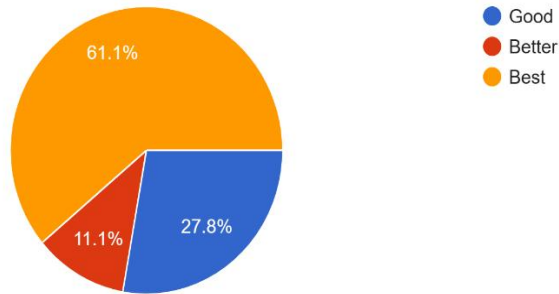


Participants feedback

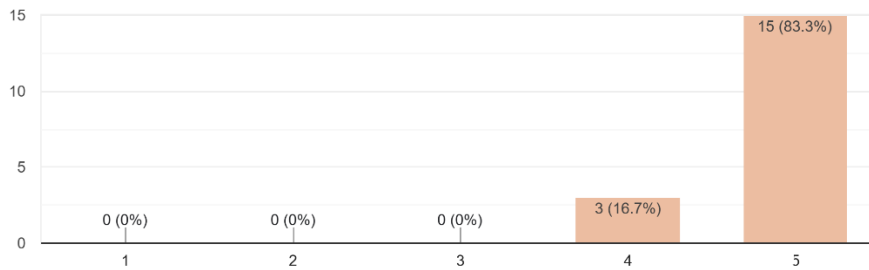
Coordination of the Program

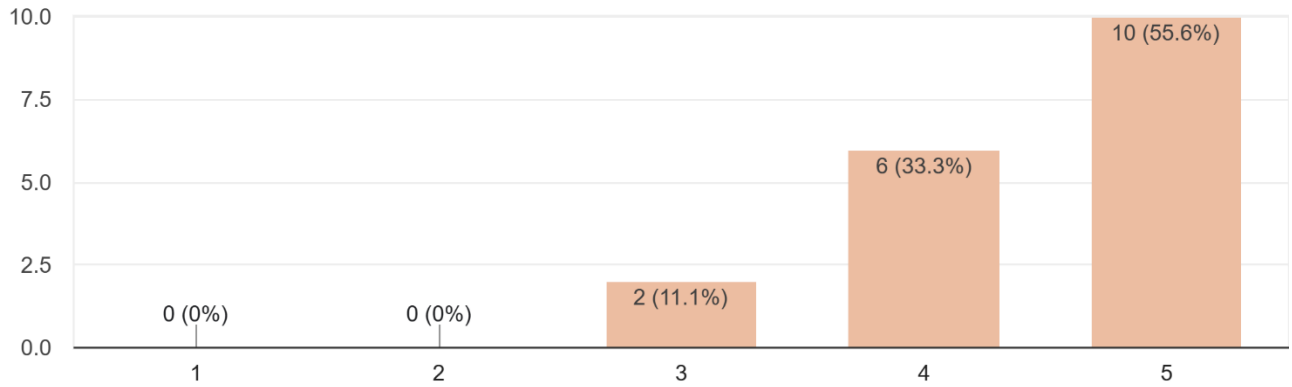
How satisfied were you with the event?

How relevant and helpful do you find it for your job?

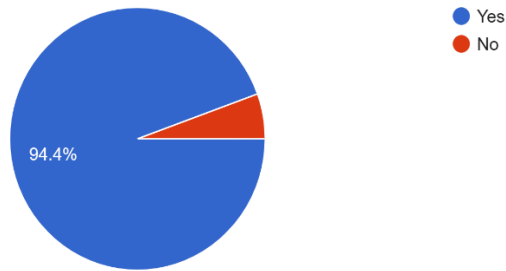

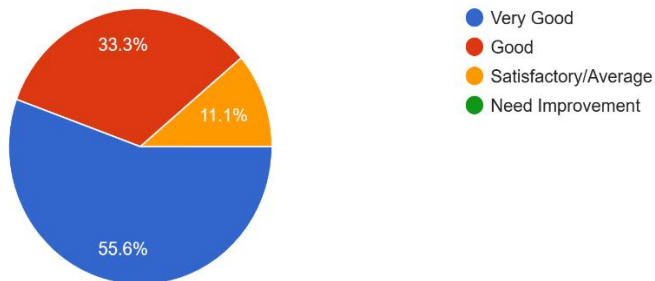
Did you like the Panel Discussion ?
