


# Shelter-based Community Libraries in Search of Alternative Livelihoods for Pavement Dwellers in Dhaka City

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




# **Zoom Education for the advance learning**

He further discussed the data fabrication and how and why it happens. He elaborated the basic concepts with varied case studies during his entire career at the Drexel university, Philadelphia, USA.Jay also suggested the commitment to research integrity for the enhanced scholarly research.

Dr Meeta Rathod Coordinator, National LDP programs & EC Member MANLIBNET gave the concluding remarks where she expressed the need of increasing awareness among the research scholars regarding the ethical behaviour to avoid the plagiarism so as the research process will be more focused and

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# **Record retention policy in Libraries**

Dr Akhtar conducted the session using the practical approach. Minute detailing and language lucidity were the major strengths of the session. Dr Akhtar initiated the basic concept of record and records management, weeding out policy. He used lucid examples from his entire professional career with IIM Indore and MANUU and also the guidelines for developing a record retention policy. and it's required administration.

The session ended with the crucial need of record retention policy where the leading associations can take the lead. The session provided practical solutions to the professionals on the record retention aspect.

Dr S K Patil, Former University Librarian Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU), Pune gave his concludary remark where he shared his work and opinion on the record retention policy need and effort must be promoted in future in this regard for maintaining a homogeneous policy document in this regard.

## **The Panel Discussion**

## Theme: Imbibing skills for today's Librarianship: Techniques and Tools

This was the pick of the program which highlighted the crucial areas to deal in coming days by the lis professionals. It also provided the guideline to the professionals in order to provide more effective services even in the current scenario and in the near future.

The session involved the sub themes like communication and analytical skills, transformation in lis education, library set up and current scenario, research skills.

Dr Sreekumar Chief Information Officer IIMK led as a chairman of the session and moderated. Dr Sree worked hard for the smooth conduction of the session and it's timely

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completion with the valid takeout thoughts. The expert panel members highlighted the subthemes very well which supported in clarifying the main theme of the Virtual International Development Program and the panel discussion theme.

Dr. Meenal Oak started with a briefing on the workshop, its objectives, and the overall feedback and response. She introduced the purpose of organizing a separate panel discussion on the last day of the programme as well as introduced the panel Chairperson for the Panel Discussion.

Dr Sreekumar Chief Information Officer IIMK led as a chairman of the session and moderated. Dr. Sreekumar briefed about the topic – Library's Business Processes and User Experience activities that they do, and the essential survival skill sets that the library professionals need to possess, and its importance in the current context. He introduced the panellists, the topic that each of the panellist has kindly consented to talk on and share their experience.

Dr. S.K. Patil spoke about Setting up a University Library for the 21 st Century. About how to Conceptualize, Design, Implement, Operate and Manage a University Library and focus all the works involved in the library. Business Processes such as classification. cataloguing/metadata, ILMS, Digital Library, Institutional Repository, Management of Electronic Resources, Systems Integration. He also discussed the User Experience- where he mentioned the important aspects to be focused such as user interfaces, websites, indexing, resource discovery platforms, assessment of usage and after all for the need to achieve the user satisfaction. He shared his vast administrative experiences of handling and administering a university library considering the business processes and user experience.

Mr. Kshor Ingale shared the current status of technology and its relevant requirements in the knowledge resource centres. He mentioned the technology Skills that are required for the librarians and information professionals for managing a digitally transformed and being competent library system, in order to be relevant and to sustain in the new

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information environment. He focused the need to focus the cloud computing, digital learning and digital services including digital institutional repositories, database search service to the customers in a customized manner.

Dr. Dahibhate discussed the Research Skills particularly research productivity metrics and their enhancement strategies. He focused the need for the research attitude among the LIS professionals and also the crucial role that has to be played by the librarians for the research scholars of various domains to increase their awareness regarding the research data management, duplicate check, tools of research, plagiarism etc.

Dr. Akhtar Parvez highlighted the Communication skills and its value for a library and information professionals. He mentioned that the Communication - skills that are very much required for librarian and to the entire information professionals including ability to communicate both orally and in writing; Motivate, establish and maintain effective working relationships with associates, supervisors, management, outside agencies and the public, Displaying a positive attitude toward library users and in particular, users with special needs. Apart from communication skills, the analytical Skills – Ability to think analytically and to develop new or revised systems, procedures, and work flows in the library processes and procedures; Ability to exercise initiative and independent judgment etc. are also important for the LIS professionals.

Dr. Mitul Nassiruddin spoke about the Emergent Need for Transformation in Library Science Education considering the need for being relevant in the Job Market, library science students possess the new era job requirements, the required soft skills, software skills. He mentioned that getting proper placements/career building the syllabus upgradation is unevitable.

The question answer session coordinated by Dr Mrs Meenal Oak. The QA session ends with a note that the value to organization is a core concept in the current changing scenario. The LIS professionals should try to satisfy the users by providing the online services specially online catalogues, ask a librarian window, library blogs and library web pages designing.

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Efforts must be done to provide the e-services to the users to satisfy their needs even through the effective remote services.
