Online Learning: A Panacea in the time of COVID-19 Crisis

The dynamics of teaching and learning are changing continuously from past few years but due to COVID-19 pandemic there is a drastic change in the education system. The lockdown led the education to go online from offline.

If we particularly talk about online learning and trace their history back then it is not something new. People might think that it rose its head only after the outbreak of the deadly most contagious Coronavirus but that only made it popular not new.

The idea of Distance learning, in particular, was born some 170 years ago when lessons in Great Britain were sent through emails and then the assignments were received¹. However, the technology now used for online classes is relatively new. Offline classes are the traditional mode of taking classes which we can say is going out to a school or an institute and attending classes with an instructor. Well, here is for the readers that they should not be confused between online and offline learning because they are both different modes serving the same purpose.

So, let's get back to offline classes which have been here for longer than we can remember and serving its endeavours with knowledge regarding different fields. Presently there is a shift from the offline mode to online at many places while some are sticking to the conventional ones.

In the starting period it was very challenging for students as well as teachers to be handy with the online education system. But till 2021 it is going quite well. Everyone was getting used to online classes and lectures.

There are various pros and cons of both online and offline education. The main aspect that differentiates online and offline education is the location. For offline education students must travel to the location of their institute. Due to which it becomes hectic and time consuming for students as well as teachers. In offline classes, the timings are fixed and there is no leniency. Research findings show that the attendance of students differs in online (72%) and offline classes (62%). Studying at any offline institute means that the lectures which have been delivered cannot be repeated. Absentees from institutes have adverse effects on the

student's academic performance. But considering these disadvantages there are many more advantages of offline learning.

We are all aware of the importance of extracurricular activities and only offline learning can serve them best. Some may believe that extracurricular activities might affect academic achievement but the research proves quite the opposite. The former improves the latter. Teacher and student interaction is pivotal in the process of learning. Offline education means the teacher gets to know their student better, not just that but when a teacher knows about their student's thinking then that helps in planning the lessons. A major upside of offline education is that it promotes teacher and student interaction and brings learning beyond traditional lecturing. Interaction raises questions regarding a certain topic which helps to explore and learn much better. Offline education has well-equipped laboratories, sports equipment, and practice rooms. As we read that offline classes increase interaction between the students and when such a healthy environment is created students tend to compete with each other which leads to better learning.

Researchers whose study supports a well-formulated classroom competition have been found to increase their learning, self-esteem, and motivation. This is most necessary for those students who have opted for courses that need practice or experimentation. If you are not opting for offline education then your learning is limited to the theory and you will never be able to fully grasp the concepts if you are unable to know their practical essence.

Now considering the online education it is less time consuming as the traveling time is not there. Also, it is more flexible and convenient for students as well as teachers. Online classes are a great opportunity to learn about the advancement in technology. Through the use of laptops or computers and connecting with other students through different mediums are enlightening them to know how they can handle the technology and make good use of it. Many of us don't really take the time to get to know our fellow students, especially in large classes. We might be too busy or we're just plain shy. An online course provides an opportunity to get to know other students via bulletin boards, chat rooms and mailing lists. I've had student's form study groups online, meeting at a local library or coffee shop. Even if you just converse online, it gives you a type of interaction with other students and other people that just isn't practical in the time-limited on-campus classroom. Most of the time,

most of what we learn in a course is forgotten within a week or two of the end of classes. Having that spark of interest and knowing how to find information online ensures that what your learning is always available to you. If you become interested in a certain topic, perhaps because of something you see, read or hear about, or perhaps because one of your children or friends has a question, you can get online and look it up. You will have developed the skills to find information, digest it, synthesize it and formulate an answer to any question that comes your way.

But in April 2020, over 120 billion students were out of school due to this drastic change. Many parents were worried as their children were not having required equipment for attending online classes. There was no interaction between teachers and students. Some students were facing internet issues which put a barrier in their education. This online education put a barrier in communication and personal interaction between teachers and students. Internet rates were touching the sky which made it unaffordable to many students and they couldn't attend the class. Online education provides unnecessary freedom to students which lacks discipline. In an online course, no one can hear you scream. And that causes discomfort for some online students. Studying alone with only the computer as your companion can be terrifying. There's no whispering in the back of the room, no wise remarks from the peanut gallery, no commanding presence at the front of the classroom pleading for everyone to listen.

Overall, I would say online education is quite scripted. It lacks emotions like laughter, joy, anger, fear, excitement and what not. I will be so glad to go back to the campus and enjoy the offline education system over online at any time.

CULTURAL CELL ACTIVITIES

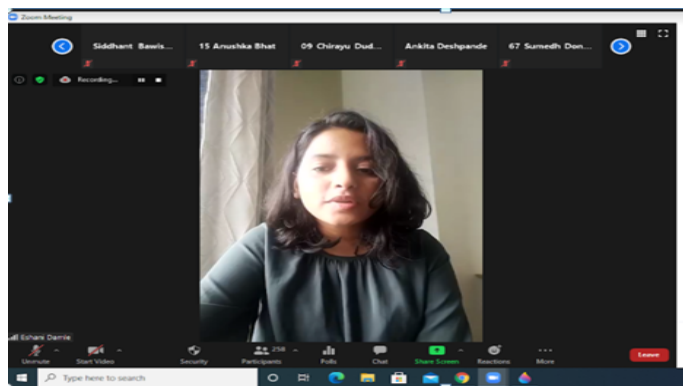
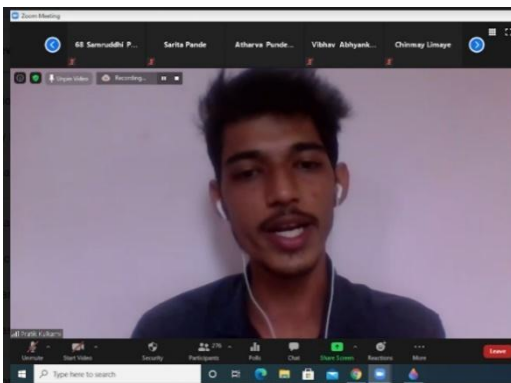
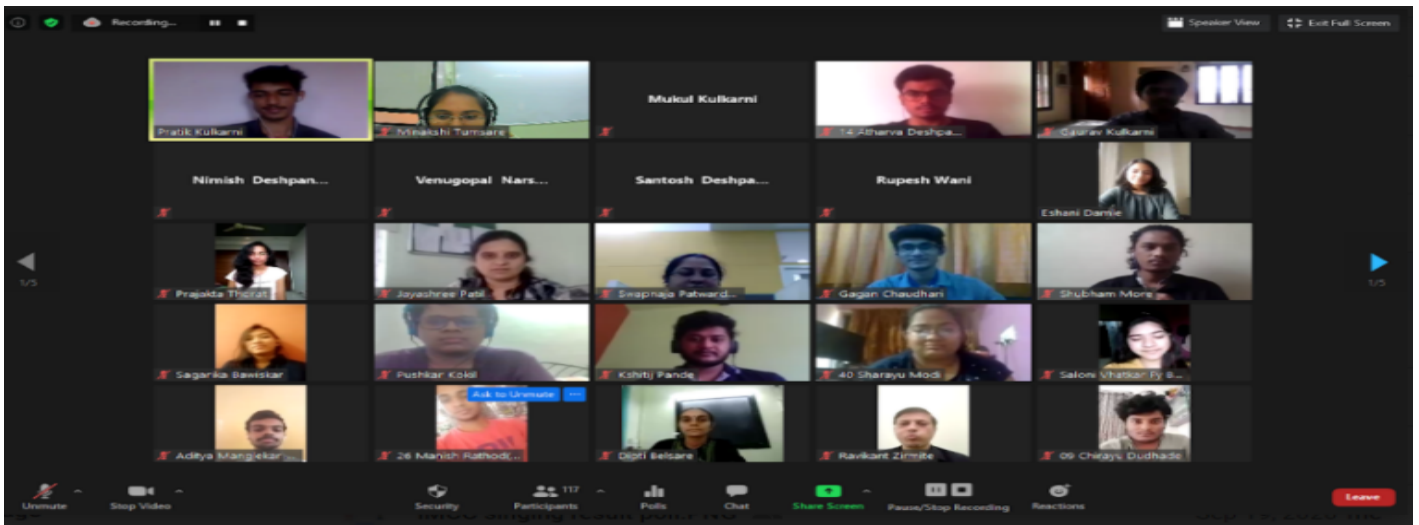

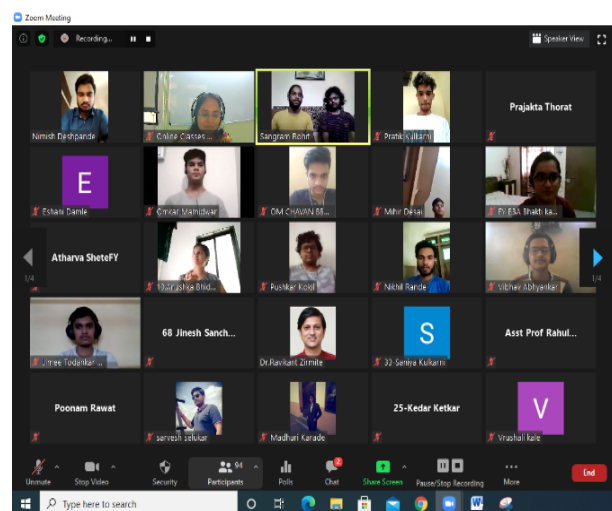
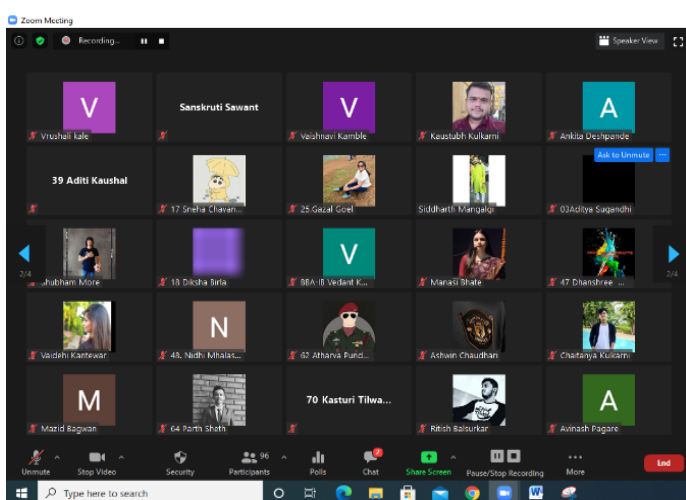
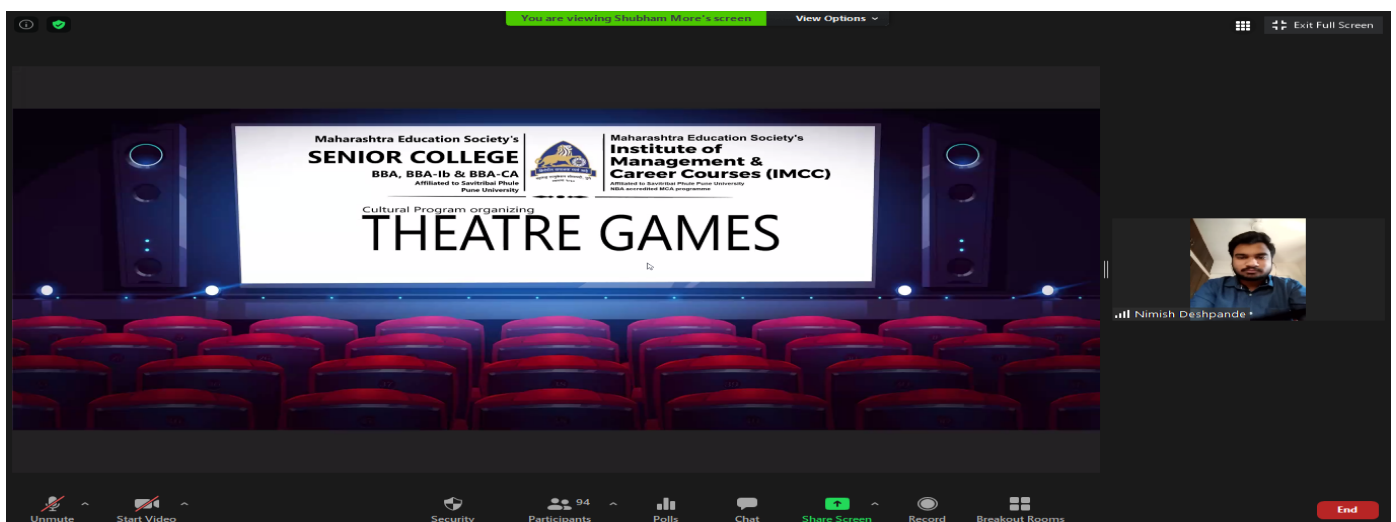
THEATRE GAMES

SHIVSWARAJYA DIN

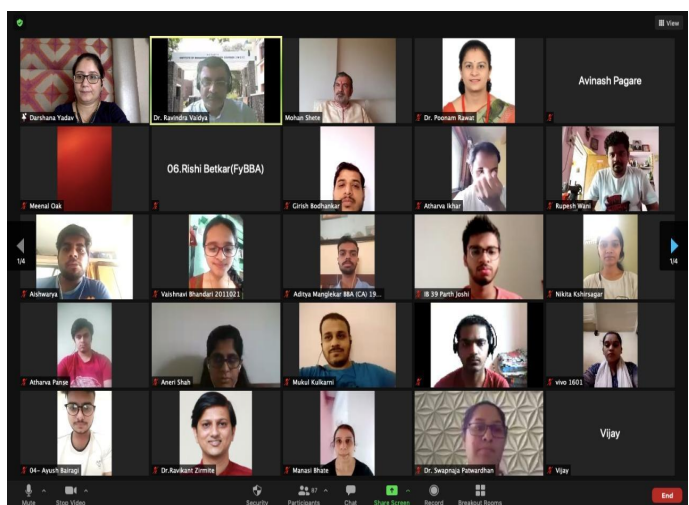
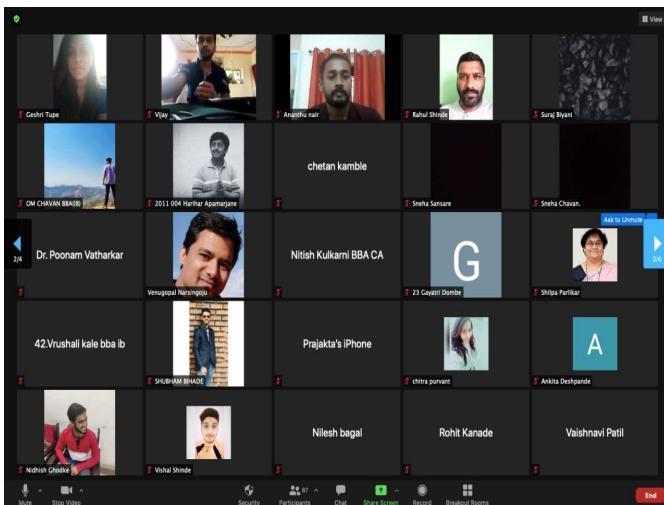

He carved out an enclave from the declining Adilshahi sultanate of Bijapur that formed the genesis of the Maratha Empire. In 1674, he was formally crowned the Chhatrapati (emperor) of his realm at Raigad.

21st June, 2021

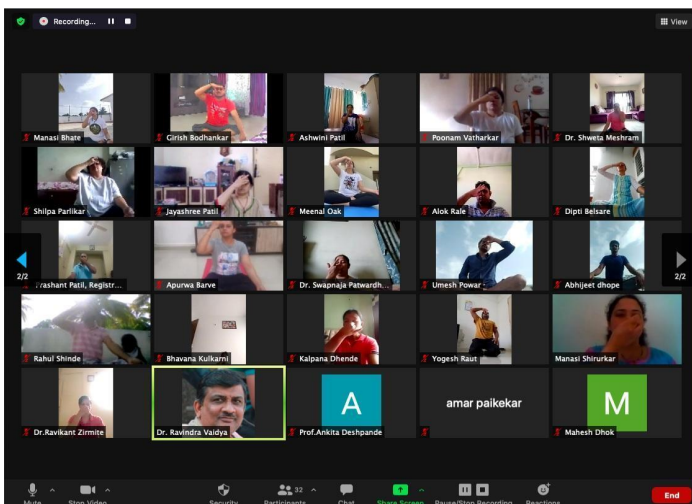
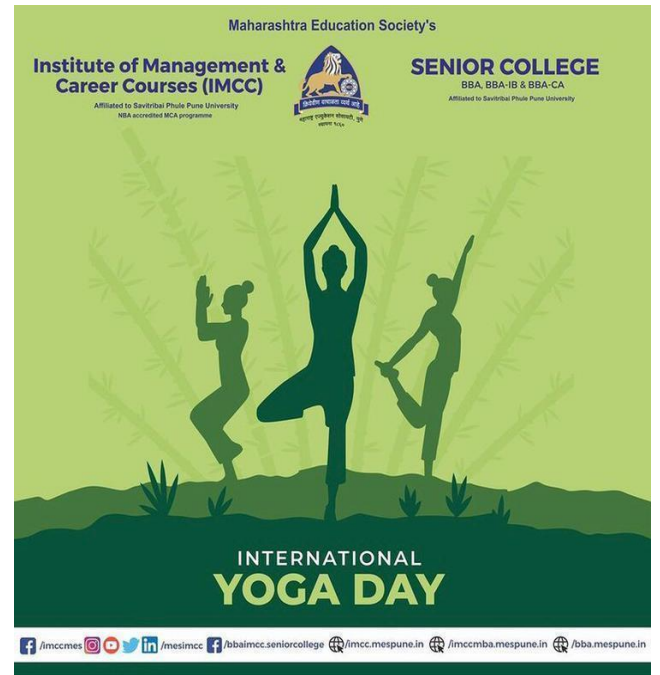

Krishna and his Management

The very first rule of management is Division of work and it was applied from the very first period in Gokul village [go means cow & Kul means village] where Shree Krishna lived his entire childhood. In villages the main occupation of people is entirely based on nature and in that the main was cow -based products [milk, curd etc] where young girl's given jobs to take milk from cows and make the curd out of it. Their mothers then sell it out in the market because they have the selling experience and young boys were given jobs to take the cows out for walks. So, the division was done so perfectly because each of them had employment and no one was poor. Here we can observe the principle of division of work.

Rule number two, Right people at right place Many people today just remember Shree Krishna as flutist. But he is more than that, we never look at Shree Krishna beyond it. He was the one who implemented new law system in kingdoms where if king son is a bad ruler, then the king should handle the kingdom again it is also known as reverse engineering the best example was set by him while he killed the Kansa [king of Mathura] the entire kingdom of Mathura was given to kansa's father Ugrasen. The Ugrasen was a good king; he had been jailed by his son kans for many years because the kans wanted the kingdom to rule according to him.

So, Shree Krishna could have kept the kingdom as he had killed the kans but he gave the kingdom to his father because he knew Ugrasen can rule the kingdom on the right path. Always put right person on top so those people will be guided in right direction

Rule number three, don't be in a negative environment. We all know the Mahabharat but what it takes Krishna to speak geta. Among the pandavas the Arjun was the main who had all astra which means It can be thrown from one place to other in today's world it's like atomic bombs and remaining four had shastra to use by hands. So, to take Arjun down Kauravas father Dhritarashtra played a mind game the day before the war Dhutarastra told his servant Sanjay to have words with Arjun. but it should be night and told him to say only these words he told "o arjun why you want to kill your people for the kingdom and what is use of it there are your brother's uncle your guru and your relative, you are going to kill them for sake of that thorn? The kingdom will remind you of their blood and flesh that you have killed.

Perhaps it is better to choose the monk life" so all this was told to Arjun by Sanjay the night before the war. by listening this the Arjun kept thinking whole night and was all came on war filed the Kurukshetra this thought strike Arjun whatever Sanjay told was right why I'm doing this so Arjun told Krishna take my chariot in middle of war field I want to see Kauravas by seeing all his family relative Arjun shattered down saying I can't able to killed them his bow fell down from hand he said "hey Madhav I can't " so if you have read Geeta

the first sloka is from Dhutarastra mouth, he is asking question to Sanjay what happened our plan is going in right direction does Arjun has begun to start thinking from our side. From this first question Sanjay got 40 questions, he had 40 shlok in geeta and the words Sanjay spoke to Arjun, Arjun got 84 questions. And to answer his question Shree Krishna has to speak 575 sholk the geta. see due to one question that was said to Arjun the day before war lead Shree Krishna to spoke 575 sholk to solve his question after all having Shree Krishna with him the one question the word spoken by Sanjay can lead to arjun in such deep reed state was he was ready to give up the war due to that one questions. So always staying alone is better than hanging out with negative people and having half knowledge.

So, there is division of work in the Mahabharat war done by Shree Krishna. Pandav sena 7 Akshauhini [1,530,900] and kaurava sena 11 Akshauhini [2,405,700] so why pandavas win and kaurava don't so in in kaurava sena everyone was the planer, manager but no one was worker so one first day Karna have taken the decision that when there is Bhishma in field, I will not participate in war so there was conflict nature in Kaurava sena so when bhishma died Karna entered war. As in Pandav sena there was one person who was doing nothing expect planning thing he was not taking any weapon but running the chariot of Arjun that is Shree Krishna next rule of management doing one work at a time

Shree Krishna was doing planning and pandavas Senapati [general of army] was given to dhrishtadyumna the brother was Draupadi but why Krishna done this because the pandavas was only given work to kill them because if they do planning they may be block mentally and physically due to this their intellectual may also block as it is matter of brothers kaurava's o they can feel bad and will not work out effectively so Krishna has not given them position of planner nor general of army but have given them work of to kill people .so this is clear cut vision of division of work ..

On other side kaurava everyone was manager planner and general there was no division of work so planning was not done properly they were caught killed by overconfidence and pandavas remain undefeated on 18th day of war pandavas win due to proper planning done by Shree Krishna. So, the management required in our life also to win all the phases of life. There are many things to learn from Shree Krishna but we should have a vision to learn. I have written what I can learn from the book written by Namdevrao Jadhav Shri Krishna the management guru.

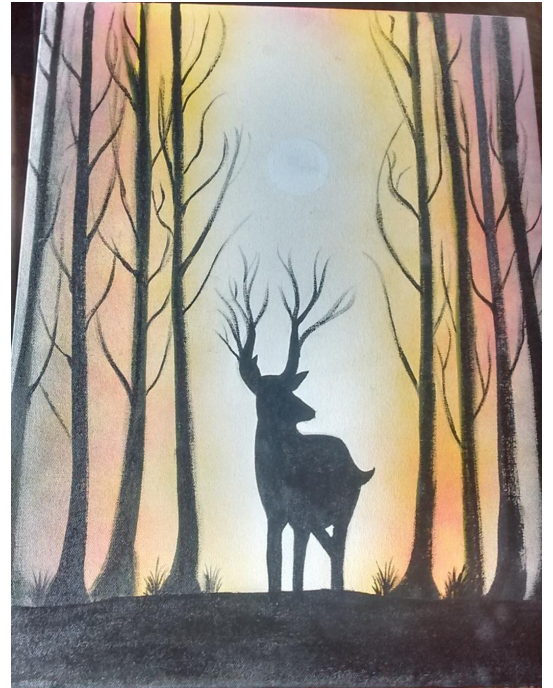
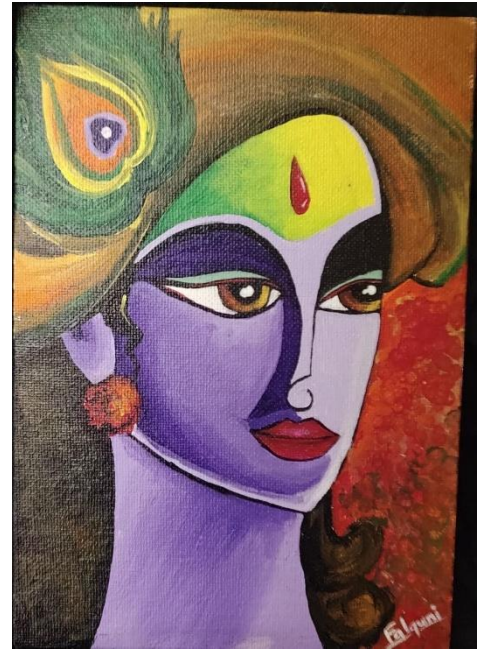
